Cross-party group to work on fresh approach to asylum seekers

Five politicians from different parties and five religious leaders will try to find practical solutions with broad support on asylum seeker policy

A number of politicians will work with religious leaders on creating a new, humane asylum seeker policy, after conceding that public opinion on the issue has shifted.

The 5/5 working group, containing five politicians from different parties and five crossdenominational religious leaders, was created during a forum in Parliament House on Thursday.

Around 50 leaders representing Christian, Muslim and Jewish faith groups met with 15 politicians from the Liberal, National, Labor and Greens parties on how to create a "solution c" on asylum seekers, away from the polarising "stopping the boats" and "opening the borders" rhetoric that has surrounded the debate.
